Key Verse: Psalm 4: 8: "I will lie down and sleep in peace, for you alone, 0 Lord, make me dwell in safety."

Don't Forget:

- 1. That hungry owl was scary, wasn't he!
- 2. Ollie and Minnie were in real danger!
- 3. Mrs. Squirrel kept Ollie and Minnie safe from harm.
- 4. She took good care of them and encouraged them.
- S. She met all of their needs. She was very kind.
- 6. Jesus wants to do that for you.
- 7. He is God so he is very strong. He is able to protect you. No one is stronger than Him!
- 8. You don't have to be scared anymore ... at school, at bed time, or when you are alone. He loves you. He is with you.

Key Questions to discuss:

- 1. Do you get scared sometimes like Ollie and Minnie? When?

Key Verses: Psalm 101: 2-4: "...I will walk in my house with a blameless heart. I will set before my eyes no vile thing ... I will have nothing to do with evil."

Don't Forget:

- 1. The Devil is real.
- 2. He is more evil than that bear.
- 3. When you don't obey Jesus or your Mom or Dad, the Devil can hurt you.
- 4. Keep close to Jesus. Talk with Him.
- 5. Ask Him to help you do good and think kind thoughts at home, at school, and when you are playing.
- 6. Please obey the Lord and your Mom and Dad. You will be protected then.
- 7. You are a Winner. The Devil is a Loser. Don't let Him control you. Say "No" to him. Say "Yes" to Jesus.

Questions for discussion:

- 1. Are you thinking about looking at evil things?
- 2. Are you thinking about doing wrong things?
- 3. Will you stop evil and do good?

Prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus,

Forgive me for the evil and wrong that I do. Help me know that I'm a Winner. Help me to obey you and my parents. Help me to have nothing to do with evil. Protect me, Lord.

Thank you, Lord Jesus.

Chapter 4 Guide The Terrible Storm!

Main Thought: You don't have to be afraid anymore!

Key verse: Joshua 1: 9: "... Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Chapter 5 Guide Help!

Main Thought: God loves to help you.

Key verse: Psalm 46: 1: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever- present help in trouble."

Don't Forget:

- 1. Ollie and Minnie needed help in that nasty waterfall. They almost drown.
- 2. Ollie called out for help! His Helper ... really our Lord Jesus, helped him and kept Minnie alive too.
- 3. Many times during your life you will need help.
- 4. You will need to depend on Jesus, your Helper ... Your Good Friend.
- 5. He wants you to call to Him for help often.
- 6. Ollie and Minnie are learning this.
- 7. We hope you will too!

Key Questions for discussion:

- 1. Do you ever need help? When?
- 2. Do you think Jesus can help you at school, at choosing loyal, caring friends, and at obeying Mom and Dad with a good attitude?

Prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus,

I confess I need help. I am weak. Thank You that You are strong. Thank You that You love to help me. Please help me where I struggle.

Chapter 6 Guide The Good News

Main Thought: Jesus loves to save you from you sin.

Key Verse: Isaiah 45: 22: Jesus is saying to you, "Turn to me and be saved ..."

Don't Forget:

- 1. The Devil destroys.
- 2. Jesus saves.
- 3. He is your Great Helper. He is God the Savior.
- 4. Only He can save you.
- 5. He has forgiven all your sins and mistakes.
- 6. He died on the Cross and paid for all of your sins.
- 7. He now wants to come into your heart and clean you and give you Eternal Life.
- 8. He rose from the dead after dying on the Cross for you. He is alive! He wants you to belong to Him. He wants you in His family forever.

Other Key Good News Verses

- Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners. Christ died for us."
- John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."
- John 1:12 "Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God."
- Joel 2:32: "...everyone who calls on the name of the LORD will be saved;..."

Revelation 3: 20: Jesus is saying to you right now,

"Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in ... "

Key Questions for discussion:

- 1. Do you want to receive (or welcome) Jesus into your heart? Do you trust that only He can save you?
- 2. Once He is in your heart and life, will He ever reject you? Read Joshua 1:5 "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Assure them of their eternal security. John 10: 27-29 "27My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. 28I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. 29My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand."

Prayer: Dear Lord Jesus,

I confess I'm a sinner and lost. Only You can forgive and save me. Please come in to my heart, clean me, and make me the kind of person you want me to be.

Thanks so much, Lord!

Chapter 7 Guide The Great Rescue

Main Thought: If you are trusting in Jesus' love and power, you can do all the things He wants you to do.

Key Verse: Philippians 4: 13: "I can do everything through him who gives me strength."

Don't forget:

- 1. If you are not depending on Jesus, you will fall flat on your face!
- 2. Ollie and Minnie could rescue the rabbit family ONLY with their Helper's help.

SAY "NO":

- To drugs.
- To the kids who are not loyal, caring, and wise.
- To sex before marriage.

Key Questions:

- 1. Who is controlling your mind, your mouth, and your actions? You or Jesus?
- 2. Are you saying "NO" to the wrong things and "YES" to the right things?

Prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus,

At times I know I'm in control: selfish, rebellious, and angry. Forgive me. Take control of me right now with your love, kindness, and strength.

Chapter 8 Guide Homeward Bound

Main Thought: True friends show they care.

Key Verse: "Carry each others burdens and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2)"

Don't Forget:

- 1. Minnie cared for Ollie enough to carry his burden.
- 2. He missed his home and family.
- 3. Minnie had not found her family yet.
- 4. She put aside her need to find her family so that Ollie could find his.
- 5. She helped to lift his burden. This is called "love".

Don't forget:

- 1. That snake from the Lost Lagoon reminds me of some bullies that teased me and hurt me.
- 2. When other kids pick on you, call you names, and push you ... that hurts! I've been there!
- 3. Sometimes you feel like crying. Go ahead and cry. It's O.K.
- 4. You can pour your heart out to Jesus.

Don't Forget:
